# Making climate adaptation in cities really work

# How to integrate climate adaptation in general urban planning

Cities operate in structural silos. However, they realise that true water management is extremely difficult to handle with these structures and mentalities. Who is responsible for the stormwater which runs off buildings, through parks, onto streets, and into canals? And how do you deal with both too much and too little water at the same time? 




# Rotterdam by night

# **Building a city beach**





# Two bridges morning run


Six kilometres in little less than an hour.


# **Getting to Rotterdam!**

# BY TRAIN OR BUS

If you arrive at Rotterdam Main Station you are right in the center of the city. When travelling via <u>NS</u> (train), it is possible to check in and out using your contactless debit card, credit card or mobile or <u>DOWNLOAD THE NS APP</u> for easy payment.

# **BY PLANE**

There are two options: Amsterdam Airport Schiphol and Rotterdam The Hague. Use the train terminal inside the airport and take one of the super convenient direct train services to the city of Rotterdam. From Schiphol it takes about 30 min, from Rotterdam The Hague even less with metro line E or bus 33.
